
# UBC Learning Circle: Dollars and Sense Webinar May 30, 2017

# WHAT DO THE NUMBERS SAY?

According to the New-to-UBC Survey 2015:



- Scholarships/Bursaries/Grants provide funding to 81% of Aboriginal Students
- 1 in 4 students want to know more about budgeting & financial planning options

# Financial supports for Aboriginal students

Key dates:

July 15: deadline to apply for student loans for September

Aug 15 – Sept 15: window to apply for UBC Bursary program and UBC Aboriginal Awards
