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

National Aboriginal Youth Suicide Prevention Strategy (NAYSPS)

- Target population: First Nations youth on-reserve ages 10-30 yrs
- Goal: reduce risk factors & promote protective factors
- Program elements –
- Range of activities
 - ASCIRT teams
 - Community based projects
 - Support to communities





- Surveillance & health assessment




Responding to mental health emergencies

- Responsive to community resiliency




First Nations Medical Officer Roles
