




What has changed and why?

- Community exploratory sessions
- Creation of community advisory committees...elders, youth, adults, staff
- Development of culturally based Train the Trainer curriculum
- Training of the community based Trainers to deliver curriculum, provide ongoing emotional support and individual coaching
- Ongoing implementation of training to other community members
