Case Study



45 year old male, car rear-ended, brought to ED by ambulance, in C collar

- Cc: Neck pain, mild chest pain + left shoulder pain
- PHx: Dyslipidemia
- ➢ O/E:
 - Oriented x 3, normal vital signs
 - midline neck tenderness + tender with neck rotation to 45 degrees
 - Left shoulder tender at acromion, deltoid, and head of humerus
 - > Able to lift left arm by self with pain to 90 degree
 - Mild chest wall tenderness at sternum, able to breathe, no step deformity
 - ECG normal





The interCultural Online Health Network (iCON)


- Engaging communities across BC to improve chronic disease management and increase culturally safe, patient-centered care
